## Student Groups Disrupt Minister Eamon Ryan Address, Call for Climate and Housing Action

23rd of March 2023 - Student groups have disrupted an event hosted by Trinity College Dublin where Minister Eamon Ryan was giving a talk at 12pm. Extinction Rebellion, Time To Act TCD, Connolly Youth Movement, Students4Change, Trinity People Before Profit have disrupted the event by setting their alarm clocks for 12:20pm and making short speeches one after the other. The students demanded that the eviction ban be extended as thousands of people are struggling with the housing crisis and the cost of living, which affects students as well as all ordinary people. As of 2022, 15,000 students are in rent or fee debt to their institutions, 88% of students worry about finances and 1/3 have considered dropping out. The students in their speeches expressed their dissatisfaction with the neoliberal government coalition and highlighted the Green's complicity in the housing crisis, climate change and the state of Irish education. The students also expressed frustration with the promises of the Green Party that they betrayed, namely relating to Direct Provision.

The student groups note that the questions for the event were pre-filtered and that this contributed to the decision to take this action. Rather than an open-ended and free debate, this event had its questions pre-filtered. Therefore, this was the only way to have our voices heard as otherwise our questions critical of the government would not be read out.

"The Fine Gael, Fianna Fail and Greens government does not care about ordinary people, students and workers, but is a government of the rich, of the vulture funds and the multinational corporations. They have consistently taken decisions against our communities. The blame for the housing crisis, for one, lies solely and squarely with the government, who have for years pursued a neoliberal policy of leaving the provision of housing in the hands of the private market. As a result, we have thousands of homeless people, including families, and many more living in housing insecurity. "The Green Party's failure to extend the eviction ban is not surprising, but nevertheless disappointing. Their broken promises over direct provision are particularly harmful to those studying in Ireland, as a safe-haven from ongoing conflict and war.
